

# SECOND READING: ROMANS 13:8-14


A reading from Romans.

#### THE CREED

Awaken us, O God. Challenge and encourage your people to value the vocation to which each is called. We pray for all discerning new possibilities or changing employment (*especially*). In all our diverse callings, teach us to love our neighbor above all else. Merciful God,

# receive our prayer.

Here other intercessions may be offered.

Be our hope, O God. We remember with thanksgiving your disciples who died in faith (*especially*). May their trust in your promise be our protection and our hope. Merciful God,

# receive our prayer.

Remember us according to your steadfast love as we offer these and the prayers of our heart, trusting in your compassion made known through Jesus Christ. **Amen.**

The presiding minister greets the assembly and invites all present to give thanks.



For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever and ever. Amen.


**INVITATION TO COMMUNION** *The presiding minister addresses the assembly in the words of Psalm 34:*
