WORD

First Reading: Jeremiah 31:31-34

L A reading from Jeremiah.

³¹The days are surely coming, says the Lord, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah. ³²It will not be like the covenant that I made with their ancestors when I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt—a covenant that they broke, though I was their husband, says the Lord. ³³But this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, says the Lord: I will put my law within them, and I will write it on their hearts; and I will be their God, and they shall be my people. ³⁴No longer shall they teach one another, or say to each other, "Know the Lord," for they shall all know me, from the least of them to the greatest, says the Lord; for I will forgive their iniquity, and remember their sin no more.

Psalm 46

L We will read the Psalm responsively. The congregation will read the sections in bold print.

God is our shelter and strength, always ready to help in times of trouble.

- ² So we will not be afraid, even if the earth is shaken and mountains fall into the ocean depths;
- ³ even if the seas roar and rage, and the hills are shaken by the violence.
- ⁴ There is a river that brings joy to the city of God, to the sacred house of the Most High.
- ⁵ God is in that city, and it will never be destroyed; at early dawn he will come to its aid.
- ⁶ Nations are terrified, kingdoms are shaken; God thunders, and the earth dissolves.

- ⁷ The Lord Almighty is with us; the God of Jacob is our refuge.
- 8 Come and see what the Lord has done.
 See what amazing things he has done on earth.
- ⁹ He stops wars all over the world; he breaks bows, destroys spears, and sets shields on fire.
- 10 "Stop fighting," he says, "and know that I am God, supreme among the nations, supreme over the world."
- ¹¹ The Lord Almighty is with us; the God of Jacob is our refuge.

Second Reading: Romans 3:19-28

L A reading from Paul's letter to the church in Rome.

¹⁹Now we know that whatever the law says, it speaks to those who are under the law, so that every mouth may be silenced, and the whole world may be held accountable to God. ²⁰For "no human being will be justified in his sight" by deeds prescribed by the law, for through the law comes the knowledge of sin.

²¹But now, apart from law, the righteousness of God has been disclosed, and is attested by the law and the prophets, ²²the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction, ²³since all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God; ²⁴they are now justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, ²⁵whom God put forward as a sacrifice of atonement by his blood, effective through faith. He did this to show his righteousness, because in his divine forbearance he had passed over the sins previously committed; ²⁶it was to prove at the present time that he himself is righteous and that he justifies the one who has faith in Jesus.

²⁷Then what becomes of boasting? It is excluded. By what law? By that of works? No, but by the law of faith. ²⁸For we hold that a person is justified by faith apart from works prescribed by the law.

Gospel: John 8:31-36

The congregation remains seated during the multi-voice presentation of the lesson.

- P The holy gospel according to John.
- C Glory to you, O Lord.
- Jesus (to the new Jewish believers): ³¹ If you hear My voice and abide in My word, you are truly My disciples; ³² you will know the truth, and that truth will give you freedom.
- Jewish Believers: ³³ We are Abraham's children, and we have never been enslaved to anyone. How can You say to us, "You will be set free"?
- Jesus: ³⁴ I tell you the truth: everyone who commits sin surrenders his freedom to sin. He is a *slave to sin's power*. ³⁵ Even a household slave does not live in the home like a member of the family, but a son belongs there forever. ³⁶ So *think of it this way*: if the Son comes to make you free, you will really be free.
