

Confession and Forgiveness

The assembly stands and turns to face the cross at the entrance. All may make the sign of the cross, the sign that is marked at baptism, as the presiding minister begins.



O God, in whom we hope, we pray for all who are in need. Provide for those who experience homelessness or hunger, support the under- or unemployed, and comfort any who are suffering this day (*especially*). Hear us, O God.

Your mercy is great.

O God, in whom we remain, we remember our loved ones who have died and now live in you (*especially*). Bring comfort and the assurance of new life to all who grieve. Hear us, O God.

Your mercy is great.

We offer our spoken prayers and those held in our hearts trusting in your mercy; through Jesus Christ our Savior and Lord.

PREFACE


It is indeed right, our duty and our joy, that we should at all times and in all places give thanks and praise to you, almighty and merciful God, through our Savior Jesus Christ.

THANKSGIVING PRAYER

Those with hearing difficulty may follow the text below as the presider offers a sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving.

Holy God, holy and mighty, holy and immortal: surrounded by evil and bordered by death we appeal to you, our Sovereign, our Wisdom, and our Judge.

We praise you for Christ, who proclaimed your reign of peace and promised an end to injustice and harm.

In the night in which he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.

Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me.

The presiding minister addresses the assembly.


There is a place for you at the banquet.

COMMUNION

When invited, gather at the altar, standing or kneeling. Receive the Body of Christ in your hand. When the cup is offered, you may drink from it or dip the bread into it. If you prefer not to receive one or both elements, indicate this by crossing your arms in front of your chest and the minister will offer you a blessing.

If you require a gluten free wafer, please let the pastor know before the service. If you desire to have the sacrament brought to your seat, simply notify an usher.

We believe that Christ is truly present in the elements of bread and wine. All baptized Christians are welcome to receive him there. To learn about being baptized, speak to a pastor.

Elizabeth of Hungary, renewer of society, died 1231 Friday, November 17, 2023

Born in Hungary, Elizabeth was betrothed to the son of the Landgrave of Thuringia, and at age four was taken to be raised with him at the Wartburg Castle. Ten years later they were married. She was very generous to the poor, and after her husband's death she lived in cruel hardship until her own death at age twenty-four.
