Children's Message

Children come forward during "This Little Light of Mine".

First Reading: Numbers 21:4-9

L A reading from the book of Numbers.

⁴From Mount Hor [the Israelites] set out by the way to the Red Sea, to go around the land of Edom; but the people became impatient on the way. ⁵The people spoke against God and against Moses, "Why have you brought us up out of Egypt to die in the wilderness? For there is no food and no water, and we detest this miserable food." ⁶Then the LORD sent poisonous serpents among the people, and they bit the people, so that many Israelites died. ⁷The people came to Moses and said, "We have sinned by speaking against the LORD and against you; pray to the LORD to take away the serpents from us." So Moses prayed for the people. ⁸And the LORD said to Moses, "Make a poisonous serpent, and set it on a pole; and everyone who is bitten shall look at it and live." ⁹So Moses made a serpent of bronze, and put it upon a pole; and whenever a serpent bit someone, that person would look at the serpent of bronze and live.

Psalm 107:1-3, 17-22

- L We will read the Psalm responsively. The congregation will read the sections in bold print.
 - ¹Give thanks to the LORD, for the LORD is good, for God's mercy endures forever.
 - ²Let the redeemed of the LORD proclaim that God redeemed them from the hand of the foe,
 - ³gathering them in from the lands; from the east and from the west, from the north and from the south.
 - ¹⁷Some were fools and took rebellious paths; through their sins they were afflicted.
 - ¹⁸They loathed all manner of food and drew near to death's door.
 - ¹⁹Then in their trouble they cried to the LORD and you delivered them from their distress.
 - ²⁰You sent forth your word and healed them and rescued them from the grave.
 - ²¹Let them give thanks to you, LORD, for your steadfast love and your wonderful works for all people.
 - ²²Let them offer sacrifices of thanksgiving and tell of your deeds with shouts of joy.

Second Reading: Ephesians 2:1-10

L A reading from Paul's letter to the church in Ephesus.

¹You were dead through the trespasses and sins ²in which you once lived, following the course of this world, following the ruler of the power of the air, the spirit that is now at work among those who are disobedient. ³All of us once lived among them in the passions of our flesh, following the desires of flesh and senses, and we were by nature children of wrath, like everyone else. ⁴But God, who is rich in mercy, out of the great love with which he loved us ⁵even when we were dead through our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ—by grace you have been saved—⁶and raised us up with him and seated us with him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, ⁵so that in the ages to

come he might show the immeasurable riches of his grace in kindness toward us in Christ Jesus. ⁸For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God—⁹not the result of works, so that no one may boast. ¹⁰For we are what he has made us, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand to be our way of life.

Gospel: John 3:14-21

The congregation remains seated during the multi-voice presentation of the lesson.

P The holy gospel according to John.

C Glory to you, O Lord.

Jesus: ¹⁴ Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness. In the same way, the Son of Man must be lifted up; ¹⁵ then all those who believe in Him will experience everlasting life.

¹⁶ For God expressed His love for the world in this way: He gave His only Son so that whoever believes in Him will not face everlasting destruction, but will have everlasting life. ¹⁷ Here's the point. God didn't send His Son into the world to judge it; instead, He is here to rescue a world headed toward certain destruction.

¹⁸ No one who believes in Him has to fear condemnation, yet condemnation is already the reality for everyone who refuses to believe because they reject the name of the only Son of God. ¹⁹ Why does God allow for judgment *and condemnation*? Because the Light, *sent from God*, pierced through the world's darkness *to expose ill motives*, *hatred*, *gossip*, *greed*, *violence*, *and the like*. Still some people preferred the darkness over the light because their actions were

dark. ²⁰ Some of humankind hated the light. They scampered hurriedly back into the darkness where vices thrive and wickedness flourishes. ²¹ Those who abandon deceit and embrace what is true, they will enter into the light where it will be clear that all their deeds come from God.
