First Reading: Genesis 2:18-24

L A reading from the book of Genesis.

¹⁸The LORD God said, "It is not good that the man should be alone; I will make him a helper as his partner." ¹⁹So out of the ground the LORD God formed every animal of the field and every bird of the air, and brought them to the man to see what he would call them; and whatever the man called every living creature, that was its name.

²⁰The man gave names to all cattle, and to the birds of the air, and to every animal of the field; but for the man there was not found a helper as his partner. ²¹So the LORD God caused a deep sleep to fall upon the man, and he slept; then he took one of his ribs and closed up its place with flesh. ²²And the rib that the LORD God had taken from the man he made into a woman and brought her to the man.

⁴what are mere mortals that you should be mindful of them, human beings that you should care for them?

⁷all flocks and cattle, even the wild beasts of the field,

Second Reading: Hebrews 1:1-4; 2:5-12

L A reading from the book of Hebrews.

¹Long ago God spoke to our ancestors in many and various ways by the prophets, ²but in these last days he has spoken to us by a Son, whom he appointed heir of all things, through whom he also created the worlds. ³He is the reflection of God's glory and the exact imprint of God's very being, and he sustains all things by his powerful word. When he had made purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high, ⁴having become as much superior to angels as the name he has inherited is more excellent than theirs.

^{2:5}Now God did not subject the coming world, about which we are speaking, to angels. ⁶But someone has testified somewhere,

"What are human beings that you are mindful of them, or mortals, that you care for them?

⁷You have made them for a little while lower than the angels; you have crowned them with glory and honor, ⁸subjecting all things under their feet."

Now in subjecting all things to them, God left nothing outside their control. As it is, we do not yet see everything in subjection to them, but we do see Jesus, who for a little while was made lower than the angels, now crowned with glory and honor because of the suffering of death, so that by the grace of God he might taste death for everyone.

¹⁰It was fitting that God, for whom and through whom all things exist, in bringing many children to glory, should make the pioneer of their salvation perfect through sufferings. ¹¹For the one who sanctifies and those who are sanctified all have one Father.

For this reason Jesus is not ashamed to call them brothers and sisters, ¹²saying,

"I will proclaim your name to my brothers and sisters, in the midst of the congregation I will praise you."

Gospel: Mark 10:2-16

P The holy gospel according to Saint Mark.

C Glory to you, O Lord.

Narrator: ² Some Pharisees came to Him to test Him *on His*

adherence to the law of Moses.

Pharisees: Is it lawful for a husband to divorce his wife?

Jesus: ³ What did Moses say to you?

Pharisees: ⁴ Moses permitted us to write a certificate of dismissal

and divorce her.

Jesus: ⁵ Moses gave you this law *as a concession* because of the

hardness of your hearts. ⁶ But truly, God created humans male and female in the beginning. ⁷ As it is written in the Hebrew Scriptures, "For this reason, a man will leave his father and mother [to marry his wife], ⁸ and the two of them will become one flesh and blood." So they are no longer two people, but one. ⁹ What God has joined

together in this way, no one may sever.

Narrator: ¹⁰ In the privacy of their dwelling that evening, the

disciples asked Him about this teaching, 11 and He went

even further.

Jesus: If any husband divorces his wife and then marries another

woman, he commits adultery against her. ¹² And if a wife

should divorce her husband and marry another, then she commits adultery against him.

Narrator:

¹³ When the crowd gathered again, the people brought their children to see Jesus, hoping that He might grant them His blessing through His touch.

His disciples turned them all away; ¹⁴ but when Jesus saw this, He was incensed.

Jesus (to the disciples): Let the children come to Me, and don't ever stand in their way, for this is what the kingdom of God is all about. ¹⁵ Truly anyone who doesn't accept the kingdom of God as a little child does can never enter it.

Narrator: ¹⁶ Jesus gathered the children in His arms, and He laid His hands on them to bless them.
