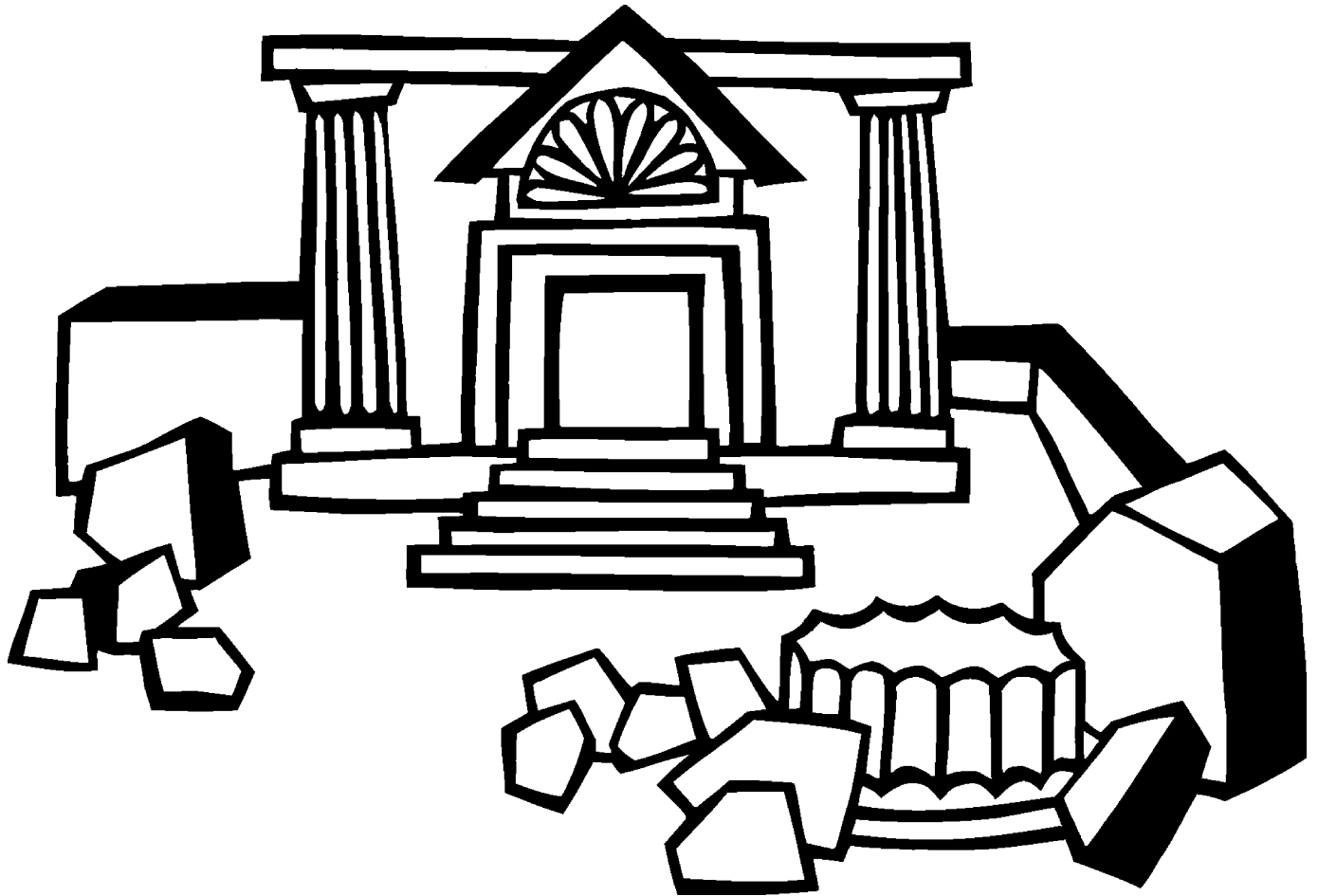

Second Reading: Hebrews 10:11-25

L A reading from Hebrews.

¹¹ Every priest stands day after day at his service, offering again and again the same sacrifices that can never take away sins. ¹² But when Christ had offered for all time a single sacrifice for sins, “he sat down at the right hand of God,” ¹³ and since then has been waiting “until his enemies would be made a footstool for his feet.” ¹⁴ For by a single offering he has perfected for all time those who are sanctified. [¹⁵ And the Holy Spirit also testifies to us, for after saying,

¹⁶ “This is the covenant that I will make with them

after those days, says the Lord:
I will put my laws in their hearts,
and I will write them on their minds,”

¹⁷ and he adds,

“I will remember their sins and their lawless deeds no more.”

¹⁸ Where there is forgiveness of these, there is no longer any offering for sin.]

¹⁹ Therefore, my brothers and sisters, since we have confidence to enter the sanctuary by the blood of Jesus, ²⁰ by the new and living way that he opened for us through the curtain (that is, through his flesh), ²¹ and since we have a great priest over the house of God, ²² let us approach with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water. ²³ Let us hold fast to the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who has promised is faithful. ²⁴ And let us consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds, ²⁵ not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day approaching.

Gospel: Mark 13:1-8

P The holy gospel according to Saint Mark.

C Glory to you, O Lord.

Narrator: As Jesus left the temple *later that day*, one of the disciples noticed *the grandeur of Herod's temple*.

Disciple: Teacher, I can't believe the size of these stones! Look at these magnificent buildings!

Jesus: ² Look closely at these magnificent buildings. *Someday* there won't be one of these great stones left on another. Everything will be thrown down.

Narrator: ³ They took a seat on the Mount of Olives, across *the valley* from the temple; and Peter, James, John, and Andrew asked Jesus to explain His statement to them privately.

Peter, James, John, and Andrew: ⁴ Don't keep us in the dark. When will the temple be destroyed? What sign will let us know that it's about to happen?

Jesus: ⁵ Take care that no one deceives you. ⁶ Many will come claiming to be Mine, saying, "I am the One," and they will fool lots of people. ⁷ You will hear of wars, or that war is coming, but don't lose heart. These things will have to happen, although it won't mean the end yet. ⁸ Tribe will rise up against tribe, nation against nation, and there will be earthquakes in place after place and famines. These are a prelude to "labor pains" *that precede the temple's fall.*
